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## Syllabus

2024-2025

## Description:

Students learn to communicate at an intermediate-high level in Spanish. Chapters present vocabulary and grammar concepts thematically in the context of the character's surroundings. Activities are communicative and incorporate a substantial review of Spanish 1 as well as incorporating new grammar concepts such as the preterite, imperfect, future, and conditional.

## Prerequisites:

Spanish 1

**DISCLAIMER:** Students entering Spanish 2 should have a basic understanding of: -ar, -er, -ir conjugation of the present tense, present progressive, reflexive verbs, indirect/direct objects, definite/indefinite articles, imperative, and basic stem changes.

## Course Progression:

The textbook has 12 chapters. We will take two weeks per chapter, and after two chapters, we will pause for a review.

**Example:** Week 1 – Ch. 1, pt. 1; Week 2 – Ch 2, pt. 2; Week 3 – Ch. 2, pt. 1; Week 4 – Ch. 2, pt. 2; Week 5 – Review of Chapters 1 & 2.

This is a distance learning (online) class that meets once per week. In an effort to make the most of our time together, students will need to read the assigned materials and complete the assigned work, unless otherwise noted, **prior** to the live session each week. Throughout the year, students will take part in our very own version of Flat Stanley™ – to showcase their Spanish skills.
